Leopard Frog

Locally extirpated species
Dorsolateral folds, dark spots
with light halos
Length: < 4"
Call: comb 'ticking', pause,
'waa...waa'
Egg mass: 1000's of eggs



American Bullfrog



Very large ear membrane, bright
green upper lip, pale belly, males
yellow chin
Length: < 8"
Call: loud, low 'drone'
Egg mass: 1000's of eggs



Tiger Salamander **AT RISK**

Distinct large yellow-greenish
blotches on dark background,
wide round head, small eyes
Length: < 13"

Long-toed Salamander

Distinct pale dorsal
stripe, very long second
toes on the hind feet
Length: < 6"





AT RISK

Spadefoot

Squat body, blunt head
& cats eyes

Length: < 3"

Egg mass: < 80 eggs

Call: loud snore

Treefrog

Black mask & 'sticky' toe pads

Length: < 2"

Egg mass: < 30 eggs

Call: 'rib-itrib-it'



Western Toad

Light dorsal strip

Length: < 5"

Egg mass: 1000's in strings

Call: rarely heard

Spotted Frog

Golden lips, dark irregular spots with light centers

length: < 3.5"

Egg mass: 1000's of eggs

Call: series of taps
